**FINANCE OFFICER ELECTION**

After many years of service as Post Finance Officer, Charles Leveille, has resigned effective October 1<sup>st</sup>.

In accordance with the Post Constitution and By-Laws, an election to choose a new Finance Officer will take place at the regularly scheduled **General Membership meeting on October 22, 2013 starting at 7:00PM.**

The individual who is elected will serve until the next general election in the spring of 2014 and can run for a full term at that time, if they so choose.

Anyone who has a knowledge of general accounting procedures including QuickBooks or similar accounting software and the financial operations of a small business, is encouraged to consider running for the office. Good computer skills are also essential.

Briefly, the Finance Officer, with the assistance of an outside accountant, is responsible for:

1. Maintaining the financial accounts of the Post.
2. Receipt of all dues and other money due the Post.
3. Coordinating the receipt and deposit of hall rental income with the Jr. Vice Commander
4. Coordinating the receipt and deposit of dues with the Adjutant.
5. Timely payment of all bills and payroll and related expenses.
6. Advise the Finance Committee if revenues or expenses are not likely to be within the amounts budgeted and approved by Post membership.
7. Being the custodian of all Post funds
8. Presentation of monthly reports to the Executive Board and General Membership
9. Timely filing of city, state and federal reports

The above is intended to present a general outline of the basic duties and responsibilities of the office and is not intended to be completely definitive of all duties and responsibilities.

**COMMANDER DELLINGER - DC**

American Legion Commander Dan Dellinger presented the American Legion legislative program to a Joint Session of the House and Veterans Affairs Committees on September 10.

So many times I hear what the American Legion is doing for veterans, listed below are a few of the many issues they are working on for us. These ten items were highlighted in Commander Dellinger's recent testimony.

1. Protect veterans and DOD from the harmful cuts imposed through sequestration. (H.R.55)
2. Oppose further increases in TRICARE fees, including prescription drug fees.
3. Properly fund VA to ensure health care and benefits fro veterans. (H.R.813/S.932)
4. Provide quality education through Post9/11 GI bill. (H.R.357/S.257)
5. Focus programs on assisting vets with jobs.
6. Support veteran-entrepreneurs.
7. End veteran homelessness (S.62/H.R.385)
8. Eliminate VA claims backlog
9. Repeal taxes that penalize disabled veterans and widows (H.R.333/H.R.303/H.R.32)
10. Protect the American flag (H.J.47/S.J.RES.17)

As you can see many of these issues are already supported by the Senate, House or Joint Resolutions.

**LEGION ON SYRIA: PROCEED WITH CAUTION**

American Legion National Commander Daniel M. Dellinger is urging Congress to consider national interests carefully before deciding whether or not to take military action against Syria.

"While we have not addressed the Syrian situation as such, we commend Congress for its due diligence under its constitutional authority" Dellinger said. "The American Legion also urges Congress and President Obama to be guided in their decisions by principles outlined in our organizations relevant resolutions. That is, American national interests should be clearly identified and defined before military action is taken.
